#### YOU WILL NEED

- Your free tile stencil ■ 1 x Annie Sloan MixMat<sup>™</sup>
- 1x120ml Chalk Paint<sup>®</sup>
- in Pure 1 x 120ml Chalk Paint<sup>®</sup>
- in Graphite 1 x Annie Sloan Large Flat Brush
- 1 x Annie Sloan Large Sponge Roller (10cm roller head)
- 1 x 120ml Clear Chalk Paint® Wax
- 1 x Small Chalk Paint® Wax Brush
- 1 x lint-free cloth 1 x tape measure or piece
- ofstring
- 1 x water-based varnish (optional)



#### FELIX'S TOP TIPS Before you start, I recommend that you give your free tile stencil a quick coat of water-based varnish. It will make it more rigid, giving it extra resilience and will last much longer.

When creating a repeat pattern with a stencil, always find the centre first using a tape measure or string. Paint your first stencil in the middle of the tabletop, to ensure your finished pattern is centred nicely.

THE HOW-TOS | STENCILLED TABLETOP

Felix guides us through the process of bringing new life using your free tile stencil and Chalk Paint® in Graph

1 Paint the surface of your table in Chalk Paint® in Graphite. Ensure it's completely dry before stencilling. Pour a small amount of Chalk Paint® in Pure onto your MixMat<sup>™</sup>. Roll the Large Sponge Roller back and forth.



Carefully place your stencil down Jon the surface one motif apart from the previous stencilled tile. Leaving a one tile gap between painting prevents the first tile motif from being smudged when you come to stencil the second.
